

NOTES FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

This Sunday, we come to the conclusion of John 6, The Bread of Life discourse, that we studied for several weeks. It is a call to believe in the Eucharist and trust in the Lord. We are called to be different; separate in holiness with the Lord. It can be difficult to live in faith, in a moral life, when the world around us thinks and goes differently. The choice is ours. Are we to take the leap of faith and choose the Lord even when He asks us to believe in that which is impossible for the mind to come to, or do we leave for an easier, less challenging faith? We have a choice.....Or do we? No, we really don't have a choice. Where else can we go? Jesus alone has the words of eternal life.

As you know, **our Holy Father will soon be visiting** the United States. To spiritually prepare for the visit, a Holy Hour on Monday, September 21, 2015 from 6:30 to 7:30pm will be held in our church and led by Bishop Malooly. This time, coordinated in parishes throughout the diocese, will unite us in prayer for our Holy Father, for the success of the World Meeting of Families Conference, and for needs of our individual and parish families on the eve of the Pope's arrival in the United States. All are welcome.

Papal Mass in DC: The Diocese of Wilmington has been awarded 24 open seating and 24 standing area tickets to the Papal Mass that will be held on the grounds of the Basilica of the National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception on Wednesday, September 23, 2015. Transportation is not included.

Mass is scheduled to begin at 4:15 p.m. The Chancery will be distributing these tickets in pairs via random drawing. To enter the drawing, each parish will be allowed to submit three (3) entries for a pair of tickets. To enter, print or type on a 3x5 index card your name, address, telephone number, and email address. Whatever card is drawn by the chancery will allow 2 tickets for the person on the card and his/her guest. Only one entry per person is allowed. Please mail this card to the parish office: St. John Beloved, 907 Milltown Rd. Wilmington, DE 19808 or drop it off at the Parish Office by Thursday, August 27.

Collective Mass:

Ordinarily, individual Mass stipends cannot be combined into a single offering and celebrated with one Mass. However within the past year, the Diocese of Wilmington has followed the practice of other dioceses where a single Mass is offered with several intentions. This is to satisfy those who find it difficult to obtain a closely available date for a Mass intention (i.e. recent death of a loved one and no current openings are available) and the declining numbers of priests to offer the Mass. In cases in which the people making the offerings have been explicitly informed prior to their offering and have freely consented to combining their offerings into a single offering, their intentions can be satisfied with a single Mass celebrated according to a "collective" intention.

The place and time for a celebration of this Mass, which is normally weekly, must be made public. The priest offering this specific Mass receives one stipend and the other stipends go to the parish or institution. In St. John Beloved Parish, this "Collective" Mass is offered at 1 p.m. on Monday afternoon now in the church because the Vianney Chapel lacks the needed space.

LITURGICAL INSIGHTS

The Feast of Our Lady Queen of Heaven and Earth

A week after the Solemnity of the Assumption of Mary body and soul into Heaven (August 15), the Church commemorates the feast of the Coronation of Our Lady, where she is crowned with the glory of Heaven. Though Mary has been honored as Queen since at least the eighth century, it is only on October 11, 1954 in his encyclical letter Ad Caeli Reginam, that Pope Venerable Pius XII, who definitively declared as dogma the Assumption of Mary, promulgated the feast of the Queenship of Mary to be celebrated on May 31, the crowning day of the month of Mary. The feast has since been moved to August 22, the octave (the eighth day) of the Assumption, since Mary is first taken to Heaven by her Son and then afterwards crowned Queen.

Mary is the paradigm of how a human being is called by God to cooperate with His grace in order to be perfected in holiness. Mary, as the mother of Jesus and, therefore, the mother of God, is privileged with being an extraordinary cooperator with God's plan of salvation through our one and only Mediator, Jesus Christ.

Mary, then, is rightly called Queen, because according to the Hebrew understanding of royalty, the mother, NOT the wife, of the king bears the title "Queen." Since Jesus Christ, her Son, is the King of kings, Mary is Queen of Heaven and Earth, a title which encourages us to ask for her intercession with her Son, the King of all Creation, as we do in, for example, the following prayer:

Hail Holy Queen, Mother of Mercy, our life, our sweetness and our hope. To thee do we cry, poor banished children of Eve, to thee do we send up our sighs, mourning and weeping in this valley of tears. Turn, then, O most gracious advocate, thine eyes of mercy toward us, and after this, our exile, show unto us the blessed fruit of thy womb, Jesus. O clement, O loving, O sweet Virgin Mary.

Sustaining Hope for the Future Update

With the latest pledge, the weekend of August 9, we are just \$250 short of reaching 94% of our goal. Those of you still intending to pledge, but desire their pledge to be used only by the Parish, or, only by the Diocese, may do so by stipulating such, in writing, with your pledge, and it will be done. Thus far, 655 pledges have been received, and only 17 have either forgotten, or have encountered difficulty in satisfying their pledge. We will soon be deciding upon the sequence of the next projects to be undertaken. You will be kept informed.



A LONG OVERDUE THANK YOU FROM THE ST. VINCENT DE PAUL SOCIETY (SVDPS)

Thank you, the St. John's parishioners, for your continuing & generous support for the Society. Please realize that the gratitude that we have for your generosity is most sincere, despite the fact that we don't say it often enough.

We have helped a significant number of people with the funds you have provided. Specifically, for our latest reporting period, Oct. 1, 2013 thru Sept. 30, 2014, we helped 329 people primarily through 168 home visits. In helping these people, we disbursed over \$50,000. This was used primarily to help pay for electricity bills, rent, and heating oil. Some of the other needs that were met were for food, auto. insurance, furniture and medical needs. We have also provided prayer books, and referrals to allow our clients to pursue their interest in furthering their faith as well as seek additional avenues of help. This activity has continued during the current year. So far we have made at least 60 home visits to families and have helped at least 120 people. We have disbursed over \$30,000, and in a number of cases have worked with other parish SVDPS as well as other organizations to multiply the impact of our expenditures.
